CURBSIDE MONITORING REALLY WORKS!

As part of its ongoing education and compliance monitoring program, curbside collection drivers inspect cart contents prior to tipping them. You may also notice the **WASTE WATCHER** vehicle in your neighbourhood, as IWMC's Compliance Officer carries out random curbside inspections across the province. This monitoring program helps to identify areas that need improvement, and educate residents by leaving a tag on the cart so they can comply with the Waste Watch program's mandatory sorting requirements.

Following a curbside inspection by the Compliance Officer, you will find one of three types of educational tags on your cart.


GREAT JOB! – If the contents of the cart demonstrate the household is doing a very good job at sorting and getting most things right, this is the tag you will get (and the one you want!). In the most recent four-week period 82% of inspected carts received this one.



ATTENTION – When the contents of the cart show an “acceptable” effort at sorting, but include some things that shouldn't be there, the cart will still be collected (whew!) but this tag will be left to indicate the errors and to provide helpful information to encourage improvements in future. 15% of the carts received this tag in the most recent four-week period.




REJECTED – When the inspection of the cart shows a poor effort was made at sorting, or that the resident needs more information about how to sort, the cart contents will not be collected. The Rejected tag will be left to identify the reason(s) why the cart wasn't collected and also to provide information to assist with improvement. Only 3% of the inspected carts in the last four weeks received this tag. That's a low number, but it still means that 88 households had to re-sort their cart's contents before it could be collected next time. We really do not want YOU to be in this group!



Here are some **common sorting errors** the Compliance Officer regularly encounters and wants you to know about, so she can hand out more Great Job! tags!

Items found in (or beside) the Waste Carts which are not “waste”:

- **Compostable items** – e.g. coffee cups, paper/fibre take out containers, boxboard (e.g. cereal boxes)



- **Recyclable items** – e.g. cans, glass bottles and jars, ♻️ - ♻️ plastic containers (e.g. containers for BBQ chickens, muffins, cookies), metals (e.g. cookie sheets, muffin tins, BBQ's, tools, cooking utensils, etc.)




- **White bags** – e.g. Kitchen Catchers. If you use these bags, please empty the contents into the waste cart and put the dirty, empty bag in the waste cart loose so the collection driver can tell it is empty.



Items found in the Compost Carts which are not “compostable”:

- Pizza boxes (take-out)
- Corrugated cardboard boxes (e.g. packing boxes)
- Plastic take-out containers, glass bottles, cans, plastic bottles



These are all recyclable and go out with your blue bags.

TWINE RECYCLING PILOT PROJECT

ATTENTION FARMERS!

To increase the recycling of agricultural plastic on PEI, **Cleanfarms** and **IWMC** are collaborating on a pilot project to collect plastic baler twine. This will help us learn more about twine recycling and, if successful, could lead to a permanent program.

To participate follow these 3 steps:

SHAKE – Remove as much debris, snow or ice as possible from your used twine. **Do not include net wrap/netting or fiber twine (sisal).**

BAG – Place loose twine in a **clear collection bag**. **FREE** collection bags from Cleanfarms for use in this project are available at the WWDCs. Poke holes in the bottom of the bag to allow moisture to drain. When the bag is full, tie it securely with twine or a zip tie.

RETURN – Return bags of used twine to a WWDC. There is no charge if the twine is clean. If it is dirty (e.g. hay, straw, clay, ice & snow) it may be rejected or subject to a disposal fee, and also reduces the chance the program will become permanent.




