Seasonal Reminders - Tips

As the summer season approaches, you may find an unpleasant odour along with insects in your compost cart. How can you avoid unwelcome smells and visitors?

- Drain excess moisture from food, place in empty boxboard containers, such as cereal boxes, or wrap meat items in scraps of paper. This will help absorb extra moisture.
- Keep carts in a shaded area when possible.
- Leave grass clippings on your lawn instead of raking them up (this is better for your lawn and the green cart).
- Place your cart out for every collection during warm months, even if it is not full.
- Wash your cart from time to time using mild detergent or a solution of vinegar and water.
- To help reduce odours and insects in your waste cart during warm months, consider
 - rinsing non-recyclable food containers and shaking them dry before placing them in the black cart.



ARE YOU LIVING ON A PRIVATE LANE OR ROAD?



If so, the private lane or road must be properly maintained to allow the collection vehicle to have access.

A passable lane for collection vehicles is one that:

- is clear from obstructions that would impede passage of collection vehicle;
- has a suitable area for collection trucks to turn if it's a dead end:
- has smooth roads with adequate surface strength, to hold very heavy trucks;
- has a relatively dry surface.

If access is not possible, carts and recyclables must be placed at the nearest serviceable road for collection.

Unsure if your road is passable? Please contact IWMC so we can assess your lane or roadway. After a large amount of rain or snow, dirt roads may be impassable due to mud, and collection drivers will need to make an assessment on access at time of collection.

QUESTIONS FROM THE COMMUNITY

Jack from Charlottetown asks:

How do I place my cart and recyclables on collection days to ensure collection?

Answer: An excellent question! IWMC has guidelines on how to place your carts and recyclables curbside or roadside on collection days to help with efficient collection and ensure the safety of residents and collection drivers.

A few guidelines are as follows:

- Carts and recyclables need to be placed within 6 feet of the curb or road. The exception to this guideline is on snowy days, carts and recyclables can be placed within 18 feet of the curb or road to allow for snow removal.
- Carts and recyclables should also always be placed on the same side of the road as your house. Under no circumstances should the material be placed across the road.

Ensuring carts and recyclables are accessible to the driver is the responsibility of the resident – this includes ensuring carts and recyclables are not buried in snow, are easily visible and are contained properly.

What If Your Monthly Recyclables Collection Isn't Enough?

Residential customers may drop off recyclables free of charge from 8 am to noon every Saturday at all Waste Watch Drop-Off Centers (WWDC's) across the province.

This includes:

- Blue Bags
- Flattened corrugated cardboard
- Larger metal household items that don't fit into Blue Bag #2
- Please remember
 guidelines apply –
 recyclables must be clean,
 dry and sorted into Blue
 Bag #1 and Blue Bag #2
- Corrugated cardboard must be flattened
- Recyclables taken to a WWDC at any other time are subject to a disposal fee based on weight.

All excess items, including additional bags and containers placed beside carts must be under 50 lb and 4 ft.
