Proper Christmas Tree Disposal

Once the holiday season concludes, it is essential to handle your Christmas tree responsibly. Islanders have three safe disposal options for their holiday trees. To ensure hassle-free disposal, remember to remove all decorations, including lights, bulbs, and wires. Please do not place your tree in a bag, as it will not be collected.

Curbside Collection

Curbside collection of Christmas trees commences on Monday, January 8th.

To guarantee your tree is eligible for collection, take note of the following: The tree must be placed curbside by 7 am on Monday, January 8th to ensure collection, which will occur sometime during that week.

Our drivers cannot return if the trees are not curbside during their pass. Ensure the tree is easily accessible, not frozen to the ground or concealed by snow, and placed where it's visible. If the tree is taller than 8 feet or heavier than 50 pounds, it must be cut in half.

If your tree was curbside by January 8th at 7 am but was not collected, please notify IWMC Customer Service no later than Tuesday, January 16th.

Deliver to a Waste Watch Drop-Off Center

Residential customers can drop off their trees free of charge at any WWDC throughout the month of January.

Deliver to a Participating Goat Farm

DON'T MISS SPRING CLEANUP!

Spring Cleanup takes place across the province as follows:

Monday, May 6th: Yard Debris Monday, May 13th: Waste Monday, May 20th: Yard Debris

*Contact IWMC by Tuesday of the following week if your material was missed.

Please follow these guidelines for Spring Cleanup

- Bundle and tie similar items, such as twigs, branches, etc.
- Each item (or bundle) must not exceed 50 lb in weight or 4 ft for any dimension.
- Place grass, leaves, and other loose yard debris in paper bags or open rigid containers (containers cannot exceed 32 gallons/121 litres).
- Place waste items in clear, transparent plastic bags, or open rigid containers (containers cannot exceed 32 gallons/121 litres).

Sorting at the Source

Sorting at the source is an important practice, empowering Islanders to play a pivotal role in caring for our planet. This simple yet powerful act involves the active sorting of items after use, directing them to the correct bins for recycling and composting, which has far-reaching implications for our environment.

Why is Sorting at the Source important? We visited the Central Compost Facility, located in Brookfield, to learn why.

Organic waste should initially be sorted correctly at the source and placed in the green bin. Once collected from residential and commercial buildings, these organics are transported to the Central Compost Facility. Here, the dedicated facility staff inspect the more than 20,000 tonnes of organic materials received annually.

Following this, organics continue to the Composting, Curing, Refining and Storage phases of the process, culminating in the creation of Category A compost. This high-quality compost can then be returned to the environment, enriching soil and promoting agricultural sustainability.

By Sorting at the Source, Islanders not only support composting but also significantly reduce contamination, minimize waste, and help build a more sustainable and eco-conscious community. Every small effort counts towards a greener, healthier planet, making Sorting at the Source a valuable practice for Islanders committed to preserving the environment for future generations.



QUESTIONS FROM THE COMMUNITY

Janet from Charlottetown asks:

"Why does sorting matter if all items end up in the same place anyway?"

Our Response:

A fantastic question, Janet. You've raised a common misconception, the idea that regardless of sorting, all items ultimately end up in the same destination. This is not correct. On Prince Edward Island, each discarded item has a designated place to go, and when sorted correctly, every item has a purpose in its "end of life."

A great example is sorted recyclables. Through proper sorting, discarded items like water bottles are directed to a facility that transforms them into new and usable products. Without sorting, these water bottles might end up in a landfill, but thanks to the Waste Watch program, they are repurposed into valuable new items. Sorting truly makes a meaningful difference.

EXCESSMATERIALS:

When your cart is full, drivers will accept up to <u>TWO</u> open rigid containers, extra bags, or bulky items placed **BESIDE** the appropriate cart. If bags are used, paper bags must be used for **COMPOST**, and clear, transparent plastic bags for **WASTE**.

All excess items, including additional bags and containers placed beside carts must be under 50 lb and 4 ft.
