


A MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

Welcome to IWMC's **Customer Service Centre!**

Located in the heart of Tignish is IWMC's Customer Service Centre. From cart repair to collection schedules to sorting information, the team at the Centre are there to answer questions and help Islanders participate confidently in the Waste Watch Program.

As the central point of contact for all residential, industrial, commercial, and institutional customers, the Centre responds to an average of 200 calls per day. They also answer emails that come to IWMC's general information address.

Some of the common tasks managed by our Customer Service team are:

- Assisting new residents with an overview of how PEI's waste management system works
- Making arrangements for delivery of Waste Watch Program carts to newly constructed properties
- Resolving road access challenges for collection vehicles
- Answering enquiries from home and business owners
- Working with property owners to find solutions for their specific challenges



WWDC Tips

Have you visited one of our **Waste Watch Drop-Off Centers**? There are six locations on PEI where you can safely drop-off sorted materials, household hazardous waste, and other items that require special disposal.

To make your visit easier, we asked our team for their best Waste Watch Drop-Off Center tips:

- ORGANIZE YOUR MATERIALS BEFORE YOU GO If you are bringing a large load of materials to a Center for disposal, try organizing the material by type in your vehicle (for example, keeping all Household Hazardous Waste together in one area can make the drop-off process faster and much smoother).
- **PLAN AHEAD** When planning to go to a Center, make sure to block off enough time for your visit. This is especially important if you have a lot of items to dispose of.
- **KEEP SAFE** Our Waste Watch Drop-Off Centers are working waste management facilities. We recommend wearing closed-toed shoes for safety.
- BRING HELP FOR BIG ITEMS You must offload items yourself at the Center. If you are bringing large items, consider taking someone with you for help.
- CHECK THE CENTER HOURS BEFORE YOU GO Visit the Disposal Facilities page on our website for up-to-date hours and contact information for each Center.
- FREE RECYCLABLES DISPOSAL ON SATURDAYS On Saturdays from 8 A.M. to 12:00 P.M., residential recyclables can be dropped off at Centers for free.



Questions from the Community

Each week, our Customer Service Centre receives questions from people across PEI. We asked some of our team members if they could answer your recent questions.

Question:

My pizza box is greasy. Is it still recyclable?

Answer: YES! Takeout pizza boxes made of corrugated cardboard are absolutely recyclable, even if there's grease on them. Please collapse and bundle them with other corrugated cardboard and place curbside on your designated recycling collection day.

Question:

If my cart gets damaged, do I have to pay for the repairs?

Answer: In most cases the answer is no. In rare circumstances, a customer may be charged for repairs.

Question:

How do I get rid of old tires?

Answer: Great question! Tires can be disposed of at the place you purchased them. You can also bring them to one of our Waste Watch Drop-Off Centers (off rims) for free disposal.

Question:

Can I use a bungee cord to keep pests out of my cart?

Answer: If you use a bungee cord to keep your cart's lid secure, you must remove it when you put your cart curbside for collection. This is because the cords can snap and injure collection drivers and get tangled in machinery causing breakdowns.


Recycle Coach is an app that's **FREE** to download on your smart device (mobile phone or tablet). It offers:

EXCESS MATERIALS:

When your cart is full, drivers will accept up to <u>TWO</u> open rigid containers, extra bags, or bulky items placed **BESIDE** the appropriate cart. If bags are used, paper bags must be used for **COMPOST**, and clear, transparent plastic bags for **WASTE**.

All excess items, including additional bags and containers placed beside carts must be under 50 lb and 4 ft.

SPECIAL DISPOSAL

PROPANE TANKS

Cylinders:

30 lb. or less: Propane tank exchange

For businesses only cylinders are accepted at WWDC and disposal fee applies

LARGE BULKY FURNITURE

Items larger than 4 ft or heavier than 50 lb are accepted at WWDC* for FREE



LARGE APPLIANCES

Bring to WWDC* for FREE disposal.



TIRES

Return to place of purchase or WWDC*. Tires without rims are FREE



PRINTER CARTRIDGES

Accepted at WWDC* for FREE and at most electronic retailers Search Printer Cartridges at www.iwmc.pe.ca/sort for more information.



HAZARDOUS WASTE

RESIDENTS: Bring to a WWDC* for **FREE** disposal - **Must be in sealed original container.**

Jerry cans and other containers must be left behind with contents.

BUSINESSES: Businesses must dispose of hazardous material through a hazardous waste

carrier. Visit www.iwmc.pe.ca/commercial for more information.
